

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EDITORIAL

Firstly, I should like to take this opportunity of thanking all of you who replied to our first piece in the W.F., and who have since completed the form sent out and agreed to lend your support. There now seems no doubt as to the need for a new association to cater for the needs of us enthusiats.

I have had many letters from prospective members offering advice, and this has been extremely invaluable to us. Your comments and constructive critiscisms are always most welcome.

I am hoping that the publication of this first newsletter will bring in support from many more enthusiasts, and I would also like to extend a warm welcome to these people, and for these people a copy of our original letter is enclosed.

The next step, after the publication of this newsletter, must be to organise a meeting to formally inaugurate the association. I imagine that this would be best held at the end of the season, say around the middle of November, in either Birmingham or Manchester, whichever best suits the majority of members. I would welcome suggestions from you as to which of the two is preferable; also any dates to avoid, and whether a Saturday afternoon or evening, or a Sunday afternoon is best. If it can be arranged, I think a meeting would be best held in conjunction with the showing of a suitable film, or some slides, and should be followed by an informal chat in such a place as some suitable refreshment can be obtained! I hope some details can be given shortly.

Following all the suggestions given, I outline below some of the ideas. I hope these will prove of interest, and will prompt further suggestions.

BOOKS: it has been suggested that a list of books on fairground and allied topics be produced, with special regard to out of print manuscripts. Perhaps it would be possible to arrange loans between members on a mutual trust basis, with the borrower paying any postage coate.

I think it would be worth trying to collect a complete set of copies of the FCSF "Merry-go-Round" and BFS "Tober' magazines for reference purposes. If it were possible, some of the articles could then be reprinted. If anyone has any spare copies available, or could lens any for copying I would be most grateful

MEMBERSHIP LIST: this will be printed and circulated after the fermal inauguration, having given membership a little time to settle down. I hope this will encourage correspondence/meetings between members.

With this idea in mind, I hope we will be able to have get-togethers at some of the larger gaffs. Anyone visiting Bridgwater on the Saturday, or hull fair either weekend can contact me for the next couple of weeks on Hull (0482) 656483.

MODELLING: there appear to be many amongst us who are keen model builders, in several different scales. It would be possible to devote a section to this topic in each newsletter, and this would enable an exchange of information and ideas to take place.

NEWSLETTERS: the general feeling seems to be that a simple duplicated sheet like this one would be preferable to a fancy, glossy magazine produced rather spasmodically as by some societies. I hope it will be possible to produce a newsletter fairly regularly, but please send me your news, views, and any article which might be smitable for publication. I have not yet looked into the possibility of reproducing photographs.

NAME / AGMs / COMMITTEE /Etc.: At our first meeting we must agree upon a suitable name, and elect a committee for the next year. It has also been suggested that we should think in terms of relatively informal AGMs, as these would be more realistic in cost.

GALLOPERS PROJECT

The above list gives brief details of most of the sets of gallopers which still survive in this country. It is hoped that this list can now be completed to include any which are missing at present, as there are almost certainly several sets in permanent parks which have been omnitted, and possibly even one or more sets in store which are not recorded.

Having established a complete and correct list, the next step is to try and pace together histories for each set, and everyone can help here by sending in information on any sets they can. Most people who have returned the forms originally sent out have agreed to participate, and there should be no worries about duplicating information, as if the same information comes from two seperate sources it is more likely to be correct. Please forward any information on the subject to myself at the usual address, and all received will be published in due course.

MAMMOTH FAIR ORGAN L.P.

News comes from Stan White of Kettering concerning the efforts of himself and others in trying to arrange for the issue of an L.P. of the old "Mammoth Fair Organ" 78's by EMI.

According to Stan the current situation is that producer Chris Ellis has sent out to various collector friends to attempt to compile a set of the 78's in good condition, which he can then listen to, and decide what is to be done next. If an issue is made, it would be on the World Records Retrospect label. EMI have no file copies of these records, and the original metal masters were destroyed in the war years, the metal being put towards the war effort.

Chris Ellis says that EMI would have to sell 3000 copies within six months of issue, and 10000+ by the end of two years, in order to make it financially sound - his main concern.

OTHER NEWS

Bimbo Bishtons spinning top ark is now also being used as a waltzer at some fairs; the cars were built by Bishtons themselves last winter, and are very smart from what I have heard.

It is thought that T. Gallagher of Hull has now also disposed of his ark. Roses have brought their jets out of storage this semon.

D. Ravenscrofts "Pop Express" made its debut earlier this season, after being purchased from the Dreamland amusement parks about two years ago.

Reuben Daniels of the Lancashire section has now acquired a waltzer to replace the ex-Prateley ark which was burnt-out last year. I don't yet know where the waltzer has come from, but another Lancashire section member, Victor Manders, is now travelling the waltzer which was previously in store at Benllech.

The Astronaut ride travelled for the past few seasons by Λ. Stokes passed temporarily to Harry Namer earlier this season, and attended a few Lancabire fairs. I believe it has now been returned to its previous owner.

On the amusement park scebe:

BLACKPOOL: T.H.F. have now disposed of the Waltzer, Slip, and Ghost Train in the Golden Mile centre to Silcock & Hill. The set of Galbopers from the same place have been moved to the park at Morecambe.

SEATON CAREW: Pairworld Ltd. have now taken over this park from Lowes, and there have been several changes. The old Waltzer has been replaced by a brand new Maxwell machine, and a skid has also been acquired. The old gallopers

have had some renovation work carried out on them, and a dummy organ fitted.

SOUTHPORT: The old set of jets formerly operated by Helters Ltd.,
has now been taken over by H. Silcock, and a new set
of continental cars fitted.

RHYL: In addition to the new Scat mentioned earlier, R. Weston has acquired a new Pollard-built Twist to replace the one which he sold to Mrs. Horne.

Price variations: the response to this has not been as good, and I think there may have been some misunderstandings as to what is involved. I still have not received any further information from Graham Downie, so further news of this will appear in our next edition.

I hope a list of current projets will be drawn up before the next newsletter appears. However, Kevin Scrivens has started work on Mont Blanes, and would welcome any information at all; please address it to him at 25 Marmion Road, Southsea, Hants. Others, of which more information will appear later, include Andersons of Bristol, about whem there is very little documentation to date, and a survey of the so-called "Coronation Machines" - how many were actually built in 1937?

I envisage the current gallopers project as a start to the compilation of a register of all current travelling and permanent site based fairground machines. This can be built up slowly, and our regular column on machine changes will keep it up to date.

MOONROCKETS - I have now built up quite a lot of information on this subject, thanks to the many letters received by myself and Kevin Scrivens. This will, hopefully, be published in due course, but in the meantime I would welcome any further information, particularly on the following machines:

Once the above are sorted out, we will have complete histories, albeit in outline only in most cases, of all Moon-rockets travelled in this country.
